TIME LIMITS THROUGHOUT: Each player will have 110 minutes +10 seconds per move increment from the start.

THE OPEN TOURNAMENT:

Open to all players.

Entry Fee: **£25****

Prizes: 1st £200 2nd £100 3rd £50

Grading Prizes: £22; awarded in bands of approximately 15 players.

THE MAJOR TOURNAMENT:

Open to all players graded 170 ECF or below.*

Entry Fee: **£23****

Prizes: 1st £180 2nd £90 3rd £50

Grading Prizes: £20; awarded in bands of approximately 15 players.

THE MINOR TOURNAMENT:

Open to all players graded 135 ECF or below.*

Entry Fee: **£23****

Prizes: 1st £180 2nd £90 3rd £50

Grading Prizes: £20; awarded in bands of approximately 15 players.

FATTORINI PRIZES:

3 additional cash prizes of £25 will be awarded to the BDCA player in each section scoring the highest points.

* Non ECF member grades will be converted by the recognised formula of $(FIDE - 700)/7.5 = ECF$. Players with a YCA grade only will be considered as ECF equivalent for 2018. All grade adjustments where deemed necessary will be undertaken by The Controllers and their decision is final.

** Junior Fees: Juniors are welcomed in all of the sections and entry fees are charged at **half price**. A junior shall be under the age of 16 before 1 September 2018.

Entry Fees: For entries postmarked after 7 September 2018 an additional fee of **£2 will be required. Entries on the day may be subject to an additional **£5**.

Disabled Players: Disabled players are welcome however please contact the Entries Secretary beforehand for details of facilities available.

OTHER MATTERS

ENTRIES: Entries must be sent to Mr D Barlow via the contact details shown on the entry form, and must be accompanied by the appropriate fees. Entries on the day may be accepted by The Controllers at the entrants' risk. The Controllers reserve the right to refuse admission into, or transfer between any sections. The Controllers' decision will be final in all matters and entry will be deemed to signify acceptance of these conditions.

RESULTS: All results will be submitted to The English Chess Federation for grading purposes.

SWISS SYSTEM: All sections will be 5 rounds, with every competitor expected to participate in each round.

GRADING, PRIZES AND TIE-BREAKS: The highest published grade will be used for all purposes in this congress. No player may win more than one cash prize.

REFRESHMENTS: The venue operates a licenced bar with coffee and tea available during most of the playing sessions. Food and drinks are also available from the kitchen area Fri 7-9pm and Sat / Sun 9am-3pm.
